

Eremias intermedia (STRAUCH, 1876)

Aralo-Caspian Racerunner

Global range: Iran, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Tajikistan, Turkmenistan, and Uzbekistan.

Distribution in Iran: Provinces of Razavi Khorasan and Semnan.

Biology: The Aralo-Caspian Racerunner lives in stabilized sand hills with semi-shrubby vegetation. This species may also be found in wide desert plains covered with scattered bushes and sandy soils. This species usually seeks shelter in rodent burrows.

Size: Snout-vent length 54 mm, tail length 91 mm.

Reproduction: Oviparous.




Fig. 223: The longitudinal rows of black or dark brown ocelli are white-centered in *Eremias intermedia*.
