Isfahan Racerunner



Global range: Iran.

Distribution in Iran: Isfahan Province.

Biology: The Isfahan Racerunner is found in wide desert regions with a scattered bushy vegetation. The habitat of this species are the plains with low, sparse vegetation beside mountains. Thus, inadvertent grazing of livestock is considered to be the main threatening factor for populations of this species.

Size: Snout–vent length 68 mm, tail length 114 mm.

Reproduction: Oviparous.
